## **WORKING WITH AFRICAN AMERICAN CLIENTS AND FAMILIES**

With ample clinical case examples and videotaped material, Dr. Boyd-Franklin will present a Multisystems Model in which Black and White clinicians will learn how to effectively use themselves in their work with African American families by:

- **Learning how to utilize cultural strengths such as the extended family network, religion and spirituality, and survival skills.**
- **Discussing the diversity within the African American community**
- **Learning about racism’s impact on family life, child rearing, gender issues, and couple relationships.**
- **Paying special attention to the “invisibility” of African American men and the fears for Black male children.**

**Learning Objectives:**

1. Participants will have a greater understanding of the subtleties of African American culture.
2. Clinicians will learn more effective strategies for joining and intervening with African American clients and families.
3. The role of spirituality and religion in African American families will be illustrated and participants will learn how to utilize these strengths in therapy.
4. Participants will learn how to involve key extended family members in the treatment process.
5. Participants will learn the importance of “the therapist’s use of self” in the treatment of African American clients and families.
